Welcome

Our library staff wishes to welcome all new and returning students and faculty. For those of you who are new and just learning about the library, and for those of you who have been using the library for years, this publication is designed to highlight our library's resources and collections, upcoming events, and new and on-going library projects.

Our staff has been busy over the summer break preparing for this upcoming academic year, and we have several new features to tell you about. We have replaced one of the printers in the student lab, and have added a scanner (located directly behind the reference desk) for use by students and faculty. Scanned items must be either saved to disk or portable hard drive,

however, as the attached computer does not have Internet access. There is now a computer located on each floor of the library with access to Murphy, KeyCite, Index to Legal Periodicals and Books, InfoTrac, LexisNexis Government Periodicals Index, and the Government Documents Catalog Server.

Also, public access to Westlaw and Lexis is now available in the library. There are four dedicated Westlaw/Lexis computers on the first floor, all with printing capabilities. Users will have access to state and federal laws, cases, and administrative materials; other available practice forms include American Jurisprudence 2d, AmJur Pleading and Practice, Federal Practice and

Meet Murphy: The Library's Catalog

Murphy is the law library's online catalog; named in honor of the former Supreme Court Justice, Governor of Michigan, and legal research instructor at the University of Detroit Mercy School of Law, Frank Murphy.

The catalog contains item and bibliographic records for the library's monographs,

monographic sets, serials, reserves, and course reserves. Murphy will allow users not only to locate a particular title, but also to search for multiple materials by topic. It is important to note, however, that pre-1984 materials are currently in the process of being re-catalogued and may not yet be in Murphy; in these cases, please

Common Library Abbreviations

ISBN (International Standard Book Number): ISBN is a ten-digit number that uniquely identifies books and book-like products published internationally. The purpose of the ISBN is to establish and identify specific editions and publishers.

ISSN (International Standard Serial Number): ISSN is an eight-digit number that identifies periodical publications, including electronic serials. There are currently more than one million assigned ISSN numbers.

LCCN (Library of Congress Control Number): LCCN is a serially based system used by the Library of Congress for numbering books; and, is used for authority, bibliographic and classification records.

OCLC (Online Computer Library Center): OCLC is a shared computer library service with over fifty-five thousand member libraries in one hundred and ten countries. This service allows users to locate, acquire, catalog, lend and preserve library materials.

available in the library). For successful searches, the record returned will provide the library location, call number, and circulation status. 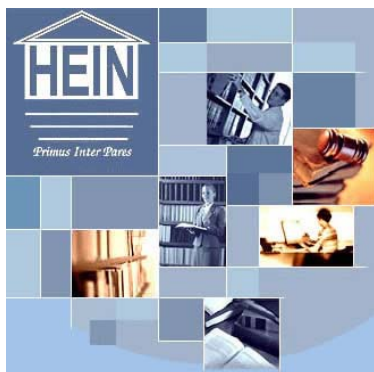

Resource Highlights

What is HeinOnline?

Lexis and Westlaw have quickly become the go-to databases in legal research. Yet, despite their incredible scope and usefulness, there are times when these two databases prove less adequate. For example, students cite checking for law reviews need articles in their original form; PDF is not available in Lexis or Westlaw. In addition, Lexis and Westlaw generally only include periodical publications after 1980. Instead of turning to a general search engine like Google, or to Interlibrary Loan services, let us suggest HeinOnline.



HeinOnline is a comprehensive, image-based, fully searchable online legal database. Exact page images in PDF format allow users to view pages as they originally appeared in print (complete with charts, graphs, and photographs). From the library computer lab and staff office computers, the database is easily accessed through the web browser homepage under *Subscribed Journals*.

The HeinOnline collection includes over four centuries of research on law, history, political science, business, public policy, government, and criminal justice. The database is divided into library modules which include the following: U.S. Federal Register Library, U.S. Treaties and Agreement Library, U.S. Supreme Court Library, U.S. Attorney General Opinions Library, U.S. Federal Legislative History Library, U.S. Statutes at Large Library, Legal Classics Library, Phillip C. Jessup Research Library, and the Presidential

Library. The collection dates back to some of the earliest legal materials (as far back as the mid 1800s).

Of particular interest is the Law Journal Library, which contains the full-text of over three hundred and seventy of the top academic law journals. The

majority of these law journals are available from the very first issue through to the most current volume allowable.

HeinOnline is an incredibly valuable resource, and one which can now be utilized from off-campus as well as from the law school.

Access Materials From Home

For a trial period, the library will be offering remote access to HeinOnline for faculty and students.

Provided below are specific instructions for accessing HeinOnline from your personal computer.

1. Go to <http://murphy.law.udmercy.edu>
2. Click on *Search the Catalog*
3. Along the right-hand side of the screen you will see a link for *Access to Databases from Home* (it's right above *Return to Main Menu*) - Click on it
4. Click on HeinOnline
5. Enter your last name and Library ID barcode (this is the number of your library card)
6. Click *Subscribers Please Click Here*
7. Begin your research

Acquisition Highlights

A Legislative History: The Development of the ABA Model Rules of Professional Conduct, 1982-2005 is a comprehensive volume tracing the history and development of the ABA Model Rules of Professional Conduct. These rules serve as the models for legal ethics rules in most states, and provide guidance for resolving ethical problems (ranging from lawyer malpractice cases to disciplinary actions to disqualification issues and sanctions questions).

The book begins with the first presentation of the Model Rules format to the American Bar Association House of Delegates at the 1982 ABA Midyear Meeting, but pays most particular attention to the amendments that have been proposed and adopted, and the rationale behind those changes, up through August 2005.

The research materials used in compiling this legislative history include Reports with Recommendations presented to the House, transcripts of House debates, and agenda books of meetings of the House Committees on Drafting and on Rules and Calendar.

Researching Government Documents

The U.S. Government is currently the largest publisher in the world with over thirty million publications distributed each year. While there are still more than twelve hundred federal depository libraries nationwide providing free access to the produced and published information of the federal government (the University of Detroit Mercy School of Law Library is one of them), the 1993 GPO Electronic Information Access Enhancement Act (under amended Title 44) now requires the Government Printing Office



to provide electronic access to this same information.

Each year there are over three hundred and fifty million documents downloaded from the GPO Access website, with total retrieval exceeding one and a half billion. These documents include laws, reports, maps, etc. and cover a range of topics from congressional to economic to health to demographic. There are over one hundred and fifty thousand electronic titles, ninety-three thousand links to other titles, and twenty-eight hundred

databases. The information on the website is the official published version, and the service is free (funded by the Federal Depository Library Program).

GPO Access provides full online access to the Code of Federal Regulations, U.S. Code and Statutes, and the Federal Register. Users can search bills, documents, committee prints, hearings, public laws, and the Congressional Directory in the *Legislative Resources* section. Other relevant sections include: *Statistical Abstracts*, *Monthly Catalog of U.S. Government Publications*, *U.S. Government Manual*, and a *Weekly Compilation*

of Presidential Documents. The entire texts of the President's proposed budget and the budget as passed by Congress are also available.

An important search tool for the GPO Access website is the *Government Information Locator Service*. This government meta-search engine will convert simple search queries into the proper search terminology for each individual government database.

The complete listing of all available resources on the GPO Access website, agencies and publications, can be found under the A-Z Resource List.

Gov. Doc Resource Highlight

The A-Z Resource List (<http://www.gpoaccess.gov/databases.html>) is a compilation of frequently used websites and Internet versions of government reference sources, organized in alphabetical order for easy accessibility.

The resources on this list range from local to international in scope, including congressional/legislative, judicial, and presidential materials.
