



Joint Juris Doctor - Master of Business Administration

The University of Detroit Mercy's MBA program offers a personal academic approach to help you prepare for a rapidly evolving business world.

Admission to the joint JD-MBA program is contingent upon separate admissions to the Law program and the MBA program. However, the applicant is not formally admitted into the Joint JD-MBA Program until satisfactory completion of the first year of law studies (30 credit hours), with no grade below 2.2 and an overall Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.80 or higher.

Program Features

- Classes Downtown! - Evening MBA classes will be available at the Riverfront Campus, 651 East Jefferson Avenue as well as the McNichols Campus, 4001 W. McNichols Road.
- Scholarships for the MBA program are available: students who score a 600 or higher on the Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT) may reduce their tuition by half. - A limited number of Graduate Assistantships are available on a competitive basis.

Admission Requirements

The Joint JD-MBA Program incorporates two sets of academic requirements. Those two sets of requirements interface to allow a significant saving in course work when compared to an individual's efforts in accomplishing both degrees on a back-to-back, or independent basis.

JD Requirements Under the Joint Program

Law School course requirements include 78 credit hours, including all required courses of the regular law curriculum.

MBA Requirements Under the Joint Program

MBA courses include from 24-45 credit hours of graduate business courses, depending upon the applicant's former exposure to business courses in general.

Depending upon the applicant's former performance in business courses work, the JD-MBA candidate may take from 0-21 credit hours in the MBA's pre-core requirements. Students having

to fulfill pre-core courses will be waived from MBA 5100. JD-MBA students are required to complete 24 credit hours in the MBA's core structure. Students are waived from MBA 5210. At the MBA post-core level, JD-MBA students are required to fulfill MBA 5900. In addition, the post-core requirement of nine credit hours of electives will be fulfilled by a cognate.

Do I need the GMAT?

1. Was your undergraduate grade point average 3.0 or above?
2. Do you have 7 or more years of professional experience?
3. Have you already earned a graduate or professional degree?

If you can answer “YES” to at least two of these questions, then you have an excellent chance to gain admission to the AACSB accredited MBA program at the University of Detroit Mercy **WITHOUT TAKING THE GMAT!** Otherwise, you should plan to submit official scores from either the Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT) or Graduate Record Exam (GRE).
